This is the list of ANZSCO Occupations in scope of the focus area 'Accounting services'.

The focus area broadly covers occupations that require specialised knowledge and skills to:

- plan and provide services relating to financial reporting, taxation, auditing, insolvency, accounting information systems, budgeting, cost management, planning and decision-making
- provide advice on associated compliance and performance requirements to ensure statutory and strategic governance.

The comprehensive review includes occupations recently updated in 2021 and 2022 so that we can apply conceptual consistency across the classification.

Only occupations relevant to the focus area are included. These are listed by their current hierarchical categories in ANZSCO.

Registration or licensing may be required for certain services such as auditing.
221112	<b>Management Accountant</b> Cost Accountant	1	Carbon Accountant Commercial Accountant Product Accountant	Provides services relating to performance-based financial reporting, asset valuation, budgetary systems, cost management, pricing, forecasting and the strategic governance of organisations. Provides advice on financial planning, risk management, carbon sequestration projects and carbon pricing and provides management with reports to assist in decision-making. May provide insight into cost performance and support the implementation of benchmarking and quality improvement initiatives. Registration or licensing may be required.
221113	<b>Taxation Accountant</b> Taxation Agent Taxation Consultant	1		Analyses, reports and provides advice on taxation issues to organisations or individuals, prepares taxation returns and reports, and handles disputes with taxation authorities. Registration or licensing may be required.

Registration or licensing may be required.
