This is the list of ANZSCO Occupations in scope of the focus area 'Aged care and disability services'.

The focus area broadly covers occupations that require specialised knowledge and skills to:

- provide assistance, support and direct care for aged and disabled persons in their own homes and in a variety of health, welfare and community settings
- provide support, information and advice to such individuals on emotional, financial, recreational, health, housing and other social welfare matters, and evaluate and coordinate the services of relevant agencies
- plan, design, coordinate and implement recreation and leisure-based activity programs to support, challenge and enhance the psychological, spiritual, social, emotional and physical wellbeing of individuals
- organise and control the day-to-day operations of a retirement village to provide a range of accommodation, personal care services, and recreational and social activities for the use and enjoyment of residents.

The comprehensive review includes occupations recently updated in 2021 and 2022 so that we can apply conceptual consistency across the classification.

Only occupations relevant to the focus area are included. These are listed by their current hierarchical categories in ANZSCO.

Skill Level 1	<ul> <li>Occupations that have a level of skill commensurate with a bachelor degree or higher qualification.</li> <li>At least five years of relevant experience may substitute for formal qualifications.</li> </ul>
Skill Level 2	<ul> <li>Occupations that have a level of skill commensurate with an Australian Qualifications Framework Associate degree, Advanced Diploma or Diploma.</li> <li>At least three years of relevant experience may substitute for formal qualifications.</li> </ul>
Skill Level 3	<ul> <li>Occupations that have a level of skill commensurate with an Australian Qualifications Framework Certificate IV or Certificate III including at least two years of on-the-job training.</li> <li>At least three years of relevant experience may substitute for formal qualifications.</li> </ul>
Skili Level 4	<ul> <li>Occupations that have a level of skill commensurate with an Australian Qualifications Framework Certificate II or III.</li> <li>At least one year of relevant experience may substitute for formal qualifications.</li> </ul>
Skill Level 5	<ul> <li>Occupations that have a level of skill commensurate with an Australian Qualifications Framework Certificate I or compulsory secondary education.</li> <li>For some occupations a short period of on-the-job training may be required in addition to or instead of the formal qualification.</li> </ul>
