ANZSCO Consultation Round 2

The ABS is undertaking a comprehensive review of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) to reflect the contemporary labour market and better meet stakeholders' needs.

Public consultation rounds are being held across 2023 and 2024 with each round targeting selected occupations grouped by focus area.

This consultation process is an opportunity for users of the classification to provide feedback on the accuracy of current occupation skill levels and descriptions and any occupations anticipated to emerge in the next 5 to 10 years.

Preliminary proposed changes are presented for 13 occupation focus areas (listed adjacent) to keep stakeholders informed of how their input is influencing changes to the classification.

Changes have been informed by user feedback received in the second round of public consultation held 15 June–11 August 2023. Over 200 submissions were received during this round from a wide range of government, business, and private industry stakeholders.

Please note that the proposed changes for selected **Computer system design and related services** occupations from the first consultation round have been included in this release. However, modifications for

Telecommunication services occupations will be released at the conclusion of the third round of consultation.

A final consultation round in 2024 will allow users an opportunity to provide feedback on the complete set of proposed changes prior to the ABS finalising the classification update for release by December 2024.

Essential Notes

Statistics NZ

ANZSCO describes all occupations for the Australia and New Zealand labour market. The ANZSCO review will focus on the Australian labour market with changes made in consultation with other Australian Government agencies and a range of external stakeholders. Statistics NZ (Stats NZ) have elected not to participate in the review at this stage and are considering whether to maintain joint custodianship of the classification with the ABS. Occupation changes have therefore been considered in respect of the Australian labour market only. New Zealand labour market references will remain largely unchanged.

ANZSCO Assessment Criteria

In this round of consultation, we have considered each stakeholder's feedback, making adjustments to ensure that the proposed changes align with the diverse needs and expectations of our user community. While many of the suggestions received have been incorporated into the proposed changes, we recognise that not all ideas could be implemented.

Factors influencing decision–making include the need to maintain the mutual exclusivity of occupation groups which ensures that a job can only be assigned to one occupation. Additionally, the implementation of some other suggestions were limited by the lack of supporting evidence and/or the need to align with statistical thresholds.

To ensure ANZSCO continues to support the production of reliable occupation–based statistics, changes to the classification need to adhere to the <u>principles of statistical classifications</u>. These principles guide the development of changes throughout the comprehensive review, ensuring the classification is well structured, clearly defined, comparable, robust, and representative.

Reviewers consider numerous factors when prioritising suggested changes received from each public consultation round. To do this, evidence provided in the submissions are collated and assessed in relation to the following criteria:

- 1. Benefits of the proposal and any alignment to policy, program or statistical need.
- 2. Risks and potential outcomes that could undermine confidence in ANZSCO and lead to poor decision making. Reviewers will also consider the relative effect on small, but important, sectors of the labour market.
- 3. Complexity, implementation, and use in labour market analysis. Some requested changes may have dependencies on other elements of ANZSCO that need to be considered holistically.
- 4. The degree of urgency and need for action, including policy drivers to address issues of national significance.
- 5. The strength of demand for this change across stakeholders and number of beneficiaries likely to be affected. Proposals with far reaching impact will be considered over those that affect a narrower segment of the labour market.

We understand that diverse perspectives enrich the decision–making process, and we encourage our users to continue sharing insights with us. Despite some ideas not being adopted at this stage, we are committed to continually reviewing and refining our approach to address concerns and improve our classification system.

Structural changes

Changes to the structure of the classification are being considered as part of the ANZSCO review. This may involve reorganising or consolidating existing occupation groups, creating new groups for emerging occupations, or adapting the structure to better reflect the relationships between occupations.





A final consultation round in mid–2024 will allow users an opportunity to provide feedback on the complete set of proposed changes, including structural alterations, before finalising the classification update for release by December 2024. Consultation with stakeholders and industry experts along with relevant data analysis will help create a more robust and adaptable classification system that accurately represents the changing nature of occupations and supports informed decision–making.

Task lists

ABS recognises the potential of Artificial Intelligence (AI) to enhance our operations and efficiency. To this end, we have employed AI to assist in the creation of initial task lists. However, human experts are responsible for the final content, and AI serves as a tool, not a decision–maker. We value stakeholder input and incorporate it into our editing process placing importance on stakeholder submissions and other relevant research contributions.

About the focus area

The Air and space transport focus area covers occupations which require specialised knowledge and skills to:

- fly and navigate aircraft, control and direct air traffic to ensure the safe and efficient operation of aircraft in flight and on the ground, and instruct students in flying aircraft
- provide services for the safety and comfort of passengers in aircraft, ships and railway sleeping cars
- load and unload baggage, direct planes, position staircases, fill aircraft fuel tanks and perform other aircraft ground services to ensure aircraft operations run efficiently
- drive a tanker truck filled with aviation fuel to waiting aircraft, attach a fuel hose to aircraft fuel tank and fill it with fuel.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Air and space transport

Feedback and diverse perspectives of stakeholders have played a pivotal role in enhancing the accuracy of existing air and space transport related occupations for ANZSCO.

Stakeholders have also presented a series of recommendations aimed at restructuring airport–related occupations within the ANZSCO hierarchy. Consequently, a proposal has emerged to consolidate several suggested occupations into a cohesive Airport Operations Officer/Manager occupation. This proposition is now earmarked for evaluation during the forthcoming review of the 139999 Specialist Managers nec category.

New occupation proposals included the addition of Airport Security Officer, Aviation Fire Fighter, and Security Screening Officer. These proposals are set to undergo an assessment alongside Public Order, Safety, and Regulatory Services occupations during the third consultation round.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Allied health

Stakeholders voiced their recommendations for structural adjustments within ANZSCO, often emphasising the need for greater specificity in organising allied health occupations.

Notably, there was a resounding call for specific and distinct unit groups for certain professions. One illustrative instance of this involves stakeholders advocating for the separation of audiology and speech pathology professions. Their proposal hinges on the profound differences in knowledge domains, tools, materials, and services provided by these professions, making a strong case for their individual categorisation.

In response to the feedback from stakeholders, a number of new occupations have been proposed. These additions include Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioner, Arts Therapist, Exercise and Sports Scientist, Music Therapist, Myotherapist, and Oral Health Therapist.

An interesting divergence from this trend was a proposal to consolidate four psychology occupations into a single unit group, with the exception of Psychotherapists, who were regarded as a distinct profession.

In addition to the suggestions for new occupation groups, stakeholders have raised requests to reallocate specific occupations to more fitting unit groups. For instance, a prominent suggestion involves shifting Occupational Therapists from their current placement under 2524 Medical, nursing, and other health care services to a more relevant 'Allied health' category, which accurately reflects their scope of practice.

A notable proposal among stakeholders was the recommendation to consolidate allied health occupations within a single, cohesive sub–major group. This reorganisation aims to improve the coherence of the classification, facilitating both understanding and utility.

Recommendations to adjust the skill level for some occupations were also submitted to accurately reflect the nature and demands of various occupations. These recommendations include the revision of Therapy Aides from skill level 4 to 3, and the revision of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Workers from skill level 2 to 4, driven by considerations of professional qualifications and responsibilities.

Changes will be implemented in a manner that aligns with industry demands, educational standards, and regulatory requirements, ensuring that ANZSCO remains both adaptable and accurate in reflecting a contemporary health workforce.

- determine construction methods, estimate building times, and required materials and quality standards
- draft and interpret specifications, drawings, plans, designs, construction methods and procedures
- obtain soil and rock samples at different sites and test samples to determine factors that affect the behaviour of soil and rock when a structure is imposed
- plan and design power stations and power generation equipment
- plan, research and advise on engineering operations for the exploration, location and extraction of oil and natural gas
- develop products such as electric motors, electronic components, equipment, appliances, circuits, and systems used for computer, communication and control systems and other industrial applications.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Architectural, engineering and technical services

The Architectural, Engineering and Technical Services focus area encompasses a broad spectrum of occupations spanning various skill levels. Stakeholders played a pivotal role in the review of these occupations providing insights instrumental to shaping the outcome of the changes, ensuring its relevance and alignment with industry needs.

In response to the recommendations and input from these stakeholders, a series of changes are proposed, including, the introduction of new occupation groups, the provision of more comprehensive information regarding lead statements, qualifications, registration prerequisites, and job responsibilities, the refinement of specialisations, and adjustments to terminology.

It is worth noting that in certain instances, some stakeholders provided divergent and conflicting updates for specific occupations, particularly concerning the introduction of new emerging occupations and specialisations. To address these discrepancies, additional stakeholder engagement and collaborative workshops were conducted, underlining the commitment to finding common ground and consensus wherever possible.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Computer system design and related services

A comprehensive review of the Information and Communication Technology (ICT) domain is being undertaken to understand the industry's recent advancements and the emerging technologies and occupations. Insights from industry experts has been essential to understanding the occupations in the modern ICT workforce.

Our consultation is continuing as only a partial number of occupations from this focus area have completed their review and are included in this release of proposed changes. The remaining occupations require more effort in their review due to the growth and variation of ICT roles within the modern workforce. The remaining proposed updates for the focus area will be released with the results from the next consultation round.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Construction

The consultation process with stakeholders in the construction focus area was marked by strong engagement and extensive feedback from both major industry organisations and smaller, trade–specific stakeholders.

A common thread among stakeholders was the desire for change with several updates to occupations proposed. This included the addition of new occupation groups and changes to lead statements, skill levels, qualifications, registration requirements, tasks, and specialisations to align with current demands and terminology improvements.

ANZSCO assigns occupations to one of five skill levels. In determining the skill level of each occupation, advice is sought from employers, industry training bodies, professional organisations and others to ensure that the information is as accurate and meaningful as possible.

Some stakeholders stressed the national significance of civil construction and infrastructure projects, the challenges in attracting workers, and the availability of Certificate III training packages as justification for raising a number of occupations to skill level 3. However, the skill level assigned to an occupation in ANZSCO is based on the requirements for competent performance of the tasks associated with that occupation, irrespective of the qualifications or characteristics of the individual performing it. Further consultation determined that the training packages whilst desirable, were not essential for performing the work. It is therefore proposed that the original skill levels be maintained for the majority of these occupations at this stage.

Another common concern raised by users of the classification was the representation of renewable energy within the Construction sector. Various stakeholders recommended that occupations be updated to better reflect jobs involving renewable gases, solar and wind turbine technology. Energy Assessors were also identified as an emerging occupation of significance.

As renewable energy technologies continue to evolve, it is clear that the construction industry will witness the emergence of new specialisations and occupations. Consequently, the classification will require further updates to accurately reflect these developments as they arise.

Electricity, gas, water and waste services

About the focus area

The Electricity, gas, water and waste services focus area broadly covers occupations which require specialised knowledge and skills to:

- control the operation of chemical production equipment, pump gas and oil from wellheads, refine and process petroleum products, and operate boilers, turbogenerators and associated plant to generate electrical power
- operate plants to store, distribute and treat water including purifying water for human consumption and removing wastes from sewage
- collect household, commercial and industrial waste for recycling and disposal.





Summary of consultation outcomes

Electricity, gas, water and waste services

Feedback received from stakeholders for occupations related to electricity, gas, water and waste services largely fell into three main areas: proposing new occupations, providing detailed qualifications and task descriptions, and addressing terminology issues.

ANZSCO plays a critical role in assessing occupational suitability, skilled migrant visa applications, and education and training program selection. Stakeholder feedback underscored the challenges in assessing qualifications for specific occupations, especially when multiple qualifications may be suitable but only partially cover the required tasks or skills.

While generally effective for qualification verification, further detail and improvements in task descriptions at the occupation level were strongly requested. Noting that task descriptions significantly influence candidates' decisions on education and training, particularly in occupations with shortages.

Users also stressed the importance of using contemporary terminology, especially for terms such as 'garbage' and 'rubbish,' which impact Unit Group 8996 Recycling and Rubbish Collectors and Occupation 899611 Recycling and Rubbish Collector. In response to this stakeholder input, changes were made to occupation titles, including the addition or removal of alternative titles and specialisations.

The lack of clear visibility of water occupations in the classification was also identified as a factor in national training needs assessment, course development, and understanding employment levels and immigration visa requirements. In light of this, Dam or Reservoir Operator and Water or Wastewater Networks Operator were proposed as specialisations of Occupation 712921 Waste Water or Water Plant Operator.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Manufacturing

The manufacturing focus area is currently experiencing a rapid transformation, driven by technological advancements, leading to the phasing out of traditional roles and the emergence of new responsibilities. This transformation is marked by key themes such as automation, digital technology, and sustainability, which have necessitated shifts in skills requirements, a heightened focus on innovation, and the adoption of new technologies to facilitate more sustainable and automated production processes.

Our engagement with stakeholders in the manufacturing sector generated valuable insights and recommendations that can be categorised into several key areas:

New and emerging occupations

Stakeholders put forward proposals for the integration of innovative and emerging roles that align with the evolving needs of manufacturing. For example, there were suggestions to establish some occupations as separate entities, such as Timber Production Manager, Timber Technician, and Pulp and Paper Production Manager. However, it was deemed more appropriate to recognise some of these roles as specialisations within the existing Occupation 133512 Production Manager (Manufacturing), as distinct tasks for separate occupations were found to be lacking.

Stakeholders also emphasised the need to categorise Printer's Assistants and Printing Table Workers under Minor Group 392 Printing Trade Workers, as these roles demand a diverse skill set involving software, machinery, and technologies. The ANZSCO review is exploring potential changes to the classification structure, which will entail reorganisation, consolidation, and the addition of new groups.

Enhanced occupation details

Recommendations were made to update information related to the qualifications, skill requirements, and specific tasks associated with various occupations. For example, the suggestion to acknowledge the creation of robotic machines as a task undertaken by Fitters was integrated into the main tasks for the Occupation 323211 Fitter (General).

There were also suggestions to incorporate additional tasks related to advanced manufacturing technology, robotics, automated machinery, finance management, and regulations for the Occupation 133411 Manufacturer.

Other submissions focused on Occupation 323214 Metal Machinist (First Class). Adding Computer Numerical Control (CNC) Machinists as a specialisation was recommended as well as broadening the main tasks to encompass automated functions.

Contemporary Language

Stakeholders voiced suggestions for changes to the language used in some occupation descriptions to align with contemporary manufacturing terms. For example, rewording the lead statement for Occupation 232313 Jewellery Designer was proposed to better reflect the tasks of a Jewellery Designer and to exclude reference to watches and spectacles.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Medical, nursing and other health care services

The consultation process for the Medical, nursing, and other healthcare services focus area was extensive and encompassed a multitude of stakeholder submissions with valuable insights and recommendations. Discussions with stakeholders was integral in refining the classification and shaping its responsiveness to the evolving landscape of healthcare services, making the consultation process an invaluable part of the classification's development.

Notable outcomes from these consultations include improving the visibility of specialised areas within Unit Group 2533 Specialist Physicians and proposing the creation of a Geriatrician occupation.

In the Nursing sector, recommendations included retiring Unit Group 411412 Mothercraft Nurse, modernising language in Occupation 254416 Registered Nurse (Developmental Disability), and consolidating Unit Group 2544 Nurses to align with contemporary healthcare needs.

For Unit Group 2515 Pharmacists, stakeholders suggested changes to Industrial Pharmacist and Retail Pharmacist. Changes to Ambulance Officers and Paramedics included splitting Ambulance Officer into Paramedic and Patient Transport Officer. Additionally, suggestions were made for Sonographer/Cardiac Technician, with conflicting views on Cardiac Sonographer's classification as a separate occupation or a specialisation.

Stakeholder input was in high demand due to the nature and breadth of the changes proposed in this sector.



Summary of consultation outcomes

Mining

In the Mining sector, a shared consensus among stakeholders emerged, suggesting that the focus area required relatively minor adjustments, mainly focusing on lead statement refinements and the addition of specialisations for most occupations. However, one notable proposal resulted in an increase to the skill levels for Drillers and Driller's Assistants, reflecting a significant recommendation in this domain.

Another key recommendation centred on the introduction of a new Closure Planner occupation, denoting professionals responsible for planning and overseeing the decommissioning of mines, power stations, and industrial sites. However, subsequent consultations revealed that this occupation may more appropriately be aligned with the responsibilities of an Urban and Regional Planner.

Stakeholders also put forth suggestions for the establishment of two additional occupations, that of Operator Port Control and Operator Mine Control. These roles involve the oversight and management of automated operations and production processes. While these proposals are set for further evaluation, the decision to move forward will be contingent on additional supporting evidence and developments, as well as the necessity to align with statistical thresholds.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Property operators and real estate

A point of interest and discussion among stakeholders in this focus area centred on the potential separate classification of Strata Managers within the ANZSCO framework. The need for a distinct classification for Strata Managers emerged as a consideration, reflecting the unique responsibilities and skills associated with this role. The proposal seeks to establish Strata Manager as a distinct skill level 2 occupation, separate from the existing Occupation 612112 Property Manager.

This proposal will undergo further assessment in conjunction with the ongoing review of changes to the classification structure, encompassing reorganisation, consolidation, and the introduction of new classification groups.

Valuable feedback was also received concerning Unit Group 2245, which comprises Land Economists and Valuers. The insights and clarifications provided by stakeholders have played an integral role in shaping the proposed changes within this unit group, ensuring that the classification is both accurate and reflective of the roles and responsibilities in this field.

In addition to this, a notable proposal argued for the inclusion of a new occupation, Infrastructure Asset Manager. However, it became evident that this proposal extended beyond the scope of the Property Operators and Real Estate focus area. Consequently, Infrastructure Asset Manager is now suggested as a specialisation under Occupation 133211 Engineering Manager, aligning more cohesively with the focus and scope of the broader Architectural, engineering, and technical services focus area.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Repair and maintenance

Technological advancements have brought significant transformations to roles within the field of repair and maintenance. Through stakeholder engagement, a diverse array of recommendations has surfaced, spanning proposals for emerging occupations and requests for new inclusions and modernisation of specialisations and specific tasks.

New and Emerging Occupations

Stakeholders championed the idea of elevating the skill level of Occupation 899911 Bicycle Mechanic to level 3, in recognition of the technological advancements in the bicycle industry. In response, a proposal has been put forward to retain this occupation but at a new skill level of 3 to reflect the increased skill level requirements involved in repairing and maintaining bicycles and e-bikes.

A proposal was also made to create a distinct category for occupations related to sign and graphics, specifically concerning Occupation 899918 Sign Erector. This proposal will undergo further assessment in conjunction with the ongoing review of changes to the classification structure, encompassing reorganisation, consolidation, and the introduction of new classification groups.

Specialisations and Task Details

In response to the growing demand for skilled technicians servicing hybrid and fully electric vehicles, a new specialisation, Electrical Vehicle Technician, has been introduced under Occupation 321111 Automotive Electrician. The burgeoning electric vehicle market in Australia, driven by government incentives and evolving consumer preferences, highlights the importance of visibility within the classification.

For occupations within the airconditioning and refrigeration repair and maintenance sector, stakeholders have provided valuable feedback. Proposed updates to the lead statement aim to create a clearer distinction between Occupation 342111 Airconditioning and Refrigeration Mechanic and Occupation 334112 Airconditioning and Mechanical Services Plumber.

About the focus area

The spatial, surveying and mapping services focus area broadly covers occupations that require specialised knowledge and skills to:

- plan, direct and conduct survey work to determine and delineate boundaries and features of tracts of land, marine floors and underground works
- prepare and revise maps, charts and other geographic products
- analyse, present and maintain geographical information about locations in space and time.





Summary of consultation outcomes

Spatial, surveying and mapping services

Stakeholders collectively expressed concerns regarding the existing representation of geospatial and surveying occupations within ANZSCO, underscoring its inadequacy in capturing the contemporary growth and diversity within this field. They voiced a strong desire to differentiate between surveying and spatial science occupations.

In their submissions, stakeholders were keen to highlight the extensive and diverse range of geospatial occupations present in today's workforce. However, accurately reflecting these specialised job titles within the classification poses challenges due to the dispersion of geospatial skill sets across various other professional fields.

A specific request was made to include a specialisation, 'Indigenous Heritage Surveyor,' for Occupation 232212 Surveyor. After careful consideration, it was determined that the tasks performed by Indigenous Heritage Surveyors align more appropriately with the proposed Occupation 272415 Heritage Consultant. Consequently, a new specialisation, 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Surveyor,' has been suggested under the Heritage Consultant occupation.

Given the rapid evolution of the geospatial industry, it is anticipated that future reviews of the classification will be essential to ensure its continual alignment with the labour market and the changing dynamics of the field.

Summary of consultation outcomes

Tourism

In the dynamic realm of tourism and hospitality, stakeholders have emphasised the critical need for an accurate and adaptable classification system that can effectively accommodate the ever–evolving trends. The feedback received encompassed a wide spectrum of aspects, ranging from the proposal of more comprehensive role definitions within the area of marine tourism, to structural changes aimed at enhancing the visibility and alignment of occupations. Additionally, stakeholders have highlighted potential issues in the skill levels assigned to specific tourism–related occupations.

One noteworthy suggestion involved the reclassification of tourism services occupations from their current placement in Minor Group 451 Personal Service and Travel Workers to a new Minor Group 453 Tourism Services Workers. This proposed change not only seeks to enhance the visibility of these occupations but also aligns ANZSCO with International Standard of Classifications (ISCO–08).

Furthermore, a proposal was put forth for the creation of a new category for Social Media Influencer (Travel), with the suggestion of placing it within Unit Group 2251, Advertising and Marketing Professionals. However, it was observed that while many individuals included "Social Media" in their occupation title in the 2021 Census, only a few mentioned the specific terms 'influencer' or 'travel'. Notably, the main tasks of this proposed occupation closely resembled those of Occupation 225114 Content Creator (Marketing), which already includes the alternative title Social Media Specialist (Marketing). Consequently, no further changes are planned for this proposal at this stage.
