Essential Notes

The Australian and New Zealand Statistical Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) describes all occupations for the Australian and New Zealand labour market.

The ABS has undertaken a comprehensive review of the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) to reflect the contemporary labour market and better meet stakeholders' needs. Public consultation rounds were held across 2023, with each round targeting selected occupations grouped by focus area.

Statistics New Zealand (Stats NZ) have elected not to participate in the current review and therefore occupation changes have only been considered in respect of the Australian labour market.

Updates to document

This document has been updated based on stakeholder feedback and further research. Minor updates have been made to a handful of occupations. The format of the document has also been updated to improve usability based on feedback received. A preliminary proposed changes document has been created for each of the 43 focus areas. Focus areas were designed to group occupations for consultation purposes only and will not be present in the classification structure.

The preliminary proposed changes presented do not include the full scope of not elsewhere classified categories (nec). Exclusion statements are incomplete and do not reference specific occupation locations within the classification. Outstanding nec categories, exclusion statements and final tweaks to occupations are currently being finalised in preparation for the release of the draft proposed classification in July on the ABS website. The July release will provide users with an opportunity to provide feedback on the structure of the proposed changes, before finalising the update for release by December 2024. These preliminary proposed changes documents are for information only.

Task lists

ABS recognises the potential of Artificial Intelligence (AI) to enhance our operations and efficiency. To this end, we have employed AI to assist in the creation of initial task lists. However, human experts are responsible for the final content, and AI serves as a tool, not a decision-maker. We value stakeholder input and incorporate it into our editing process placing importance on stakeholder submissions and other relevant research contributions.

About the focus area

The Public order, safety and regulatory services focus area covers occupations which require specialised knowledge and skills to:

- provide high level management to support the running of organisational, geographical and operational units and sections within the fire and police services
- support organisations, government, individuals and the community by liaising with constituents and the media, facilitating communication between different groups, and assessing compliance with requirements
- manage the electorate office of a politician, and liaise with constituents and the media on their behalf
- establish and facilitate communication between individuals, different community groups, organisations and governments
- investigate and report on patent applications to assess their compliance with requirements
- attend emergencies to minimise risk to community safety and security and protect life and property
- protect and preserve property, public order and safety through the enforcement of laws
- supervise and control the activities of inmates in a correctional institution
- provide security and investigative services to organisations and individuals
- direct road traffic or pedestrian flows during road closures, public events or emergency responses.

Summary of consultation

Stakeholder feedback emphasised the need to update terminology across occupations in the Public order, safety, and regulatory services focus area.

Additionally, visibility for new occupations in the current labour market was a key consideration. In response, existing occupation titles, specialisations, and descriptions were revised to use contemporary language that accurately reflects industry terminology. Skill levels for security-related roles were elevated to align with necessary qualifications and licensing requirements. Furthermore, some occupations were restructured, creating new roles at higher skill levels to recognise the expertise, experience, and training required for specialist positions. These changes aim to enhance visibility for occupations that play a crucial role in ensuring public safety and security.

- Undertakes vehicle crash investigation and analysis including by applying specialist techniques to analyse complex crashes
